Project Summary The Community Arts Development project is a triennial funding scheme designed to support the work of three major community arts organizations; The Women’s Circus, The Torch Project and Somebody’s Daughter. The evaluation tracks the work of these organizations using a mixture of questionnaires, interviews, story-based discursive techniques, media monitoring and observation, in order to provide a rare longitudinal study of the mental health and social effects of participation in art making.
